Final Outcome and Impact



Brand and Marketing Reach

Bundesliga Match Facts broadcasted in more than 200 countries reaching over 500M Bundesliga fans.



System Performance Improvement

The implemented serverless architecture for streaming of match statistics for web and mobile app increased the overall system performance 10 times compared to the legacy architecture.



Cost Reduction

Savings of ~75% on the infrastructure costs incurred on the data streaming architecture.

Starting Point



Vastly distributed content

Content in catalogues, apps, web, printed manuals, and videos was vastly distributed and required review and transformation



No clear vision on voice skill

Many ideas for a potential design of the Alexa Skill made it hard to prioritize. Definition of relevant content along the customer journey through a developed customer journey matrix was required



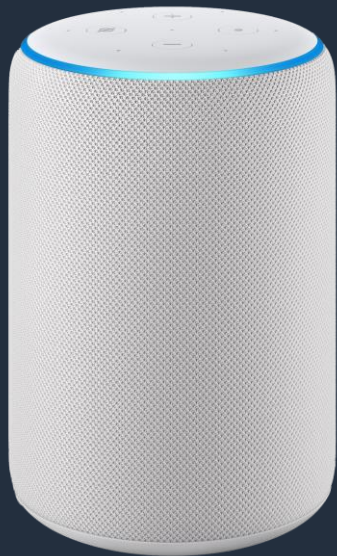
Unclear user behavior and requirements

The definition of utterances and prompts was difficult but necessary to ensure a functioning Alexa Skill and to orchestrate content provision. A recognition schema was developed for the customer

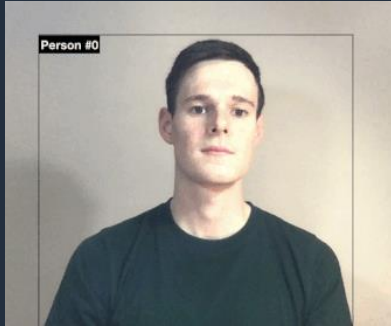

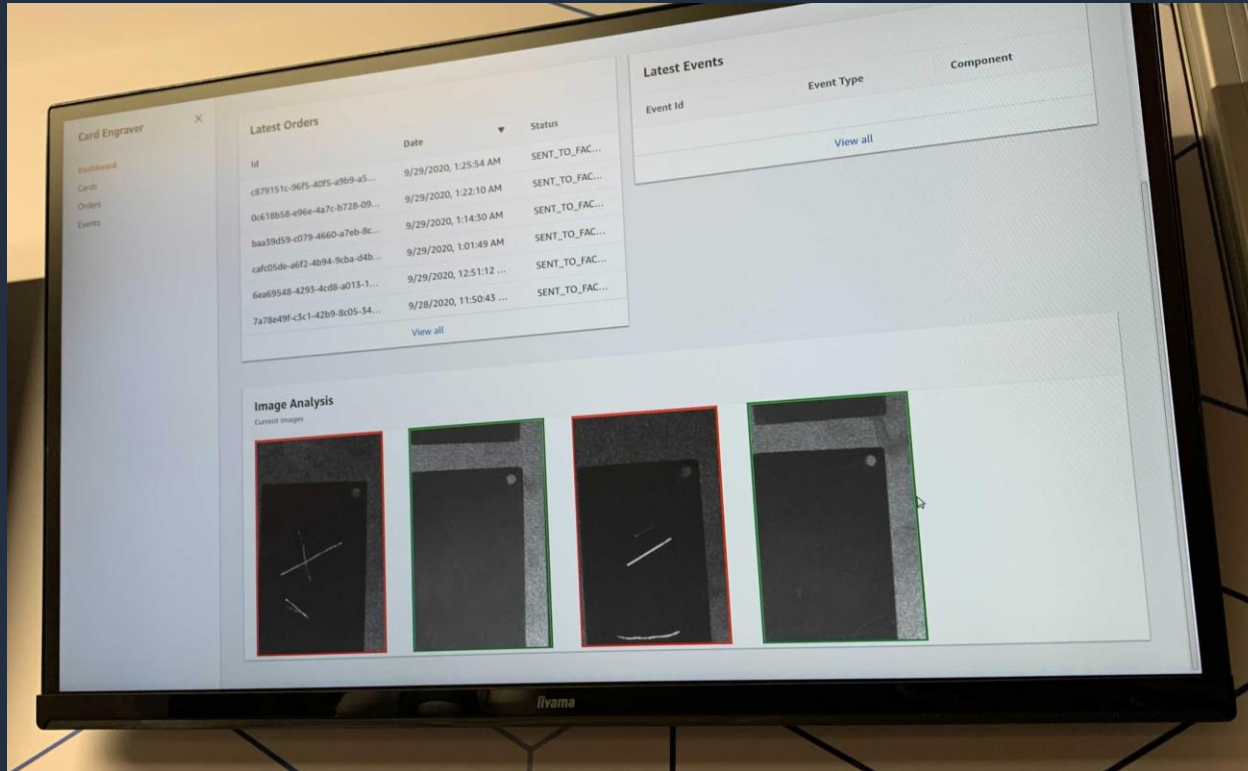

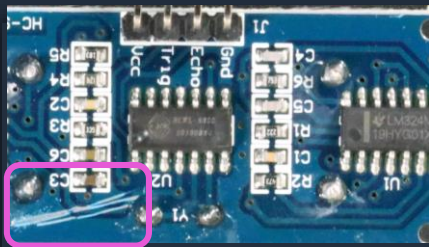

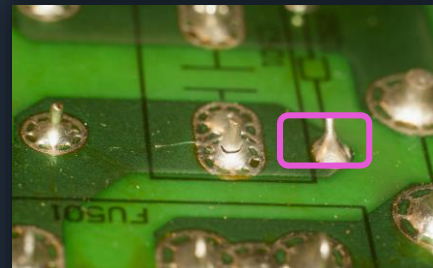

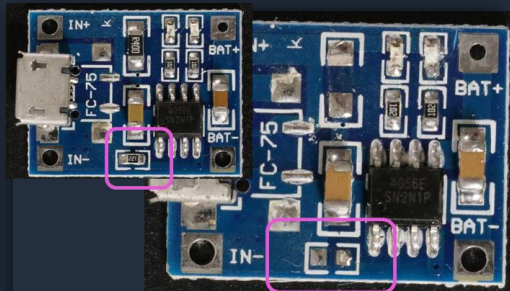

Prototyping Area: Industrial Digital Twin Watertank Demo



Our Use Case

Customer Challenge

- An industrial company needs to monitor their water tanks in treatment facilities:
 - State of the tanks (water level, leaks) and content (pH levels, ammoniac metering)
 - Raise alerts when anomalies are detected
- The systems are deployed in poorly accessible areas:
 - Operations require remote supervision to limit on-site intervention costs

AWS Approach

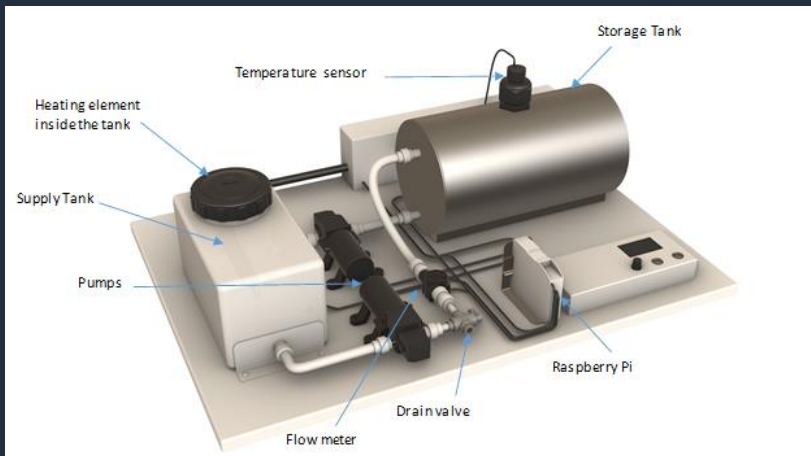
- IoT sensors deployed on the system send data to AWS Cloud
- A Virtual and Augmented Reality representation of the system provides real-time and intuitive monitoring for the Operations

Outcome

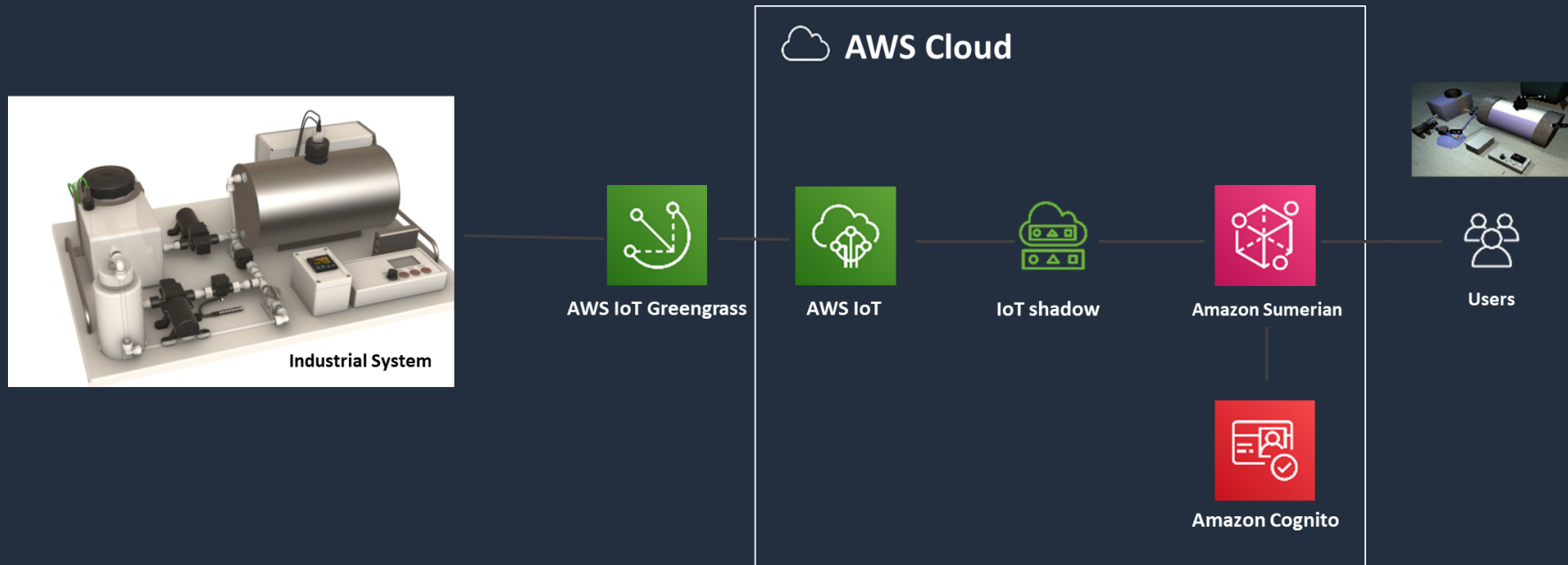
- Real-time remote monitoring of tanks inside facilities
- Cost reduction in terms of human manual interventions required

The Prototype

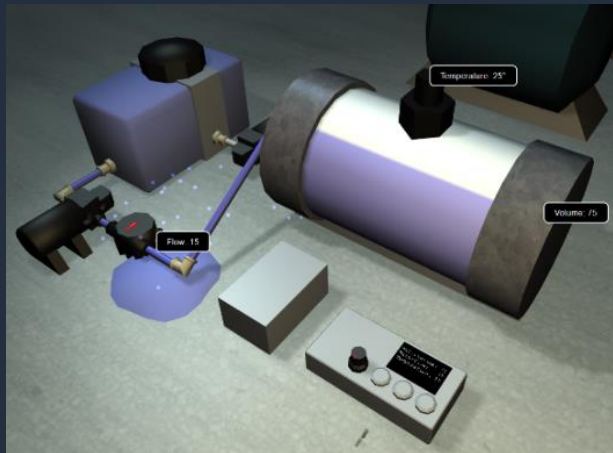
- A fully functioning water system including a supply tank, a storage tank and pumps to exchange water between the two reservoirs
- Monitors flow rates, volume, temperature, power consumptions and leaks

Demonstrator user experience

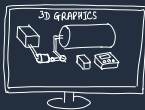


All events are generated live with the demonstrator:

- Water flow
- Volume & Temperature change in storage tank
- Leak

Real time visualization:

- 3D from a web browser
- VR using VR headset
- AR using smartphone
 - based on markers on the tank
 - or with a paper marker laid flat on a table when running without the demonstrator



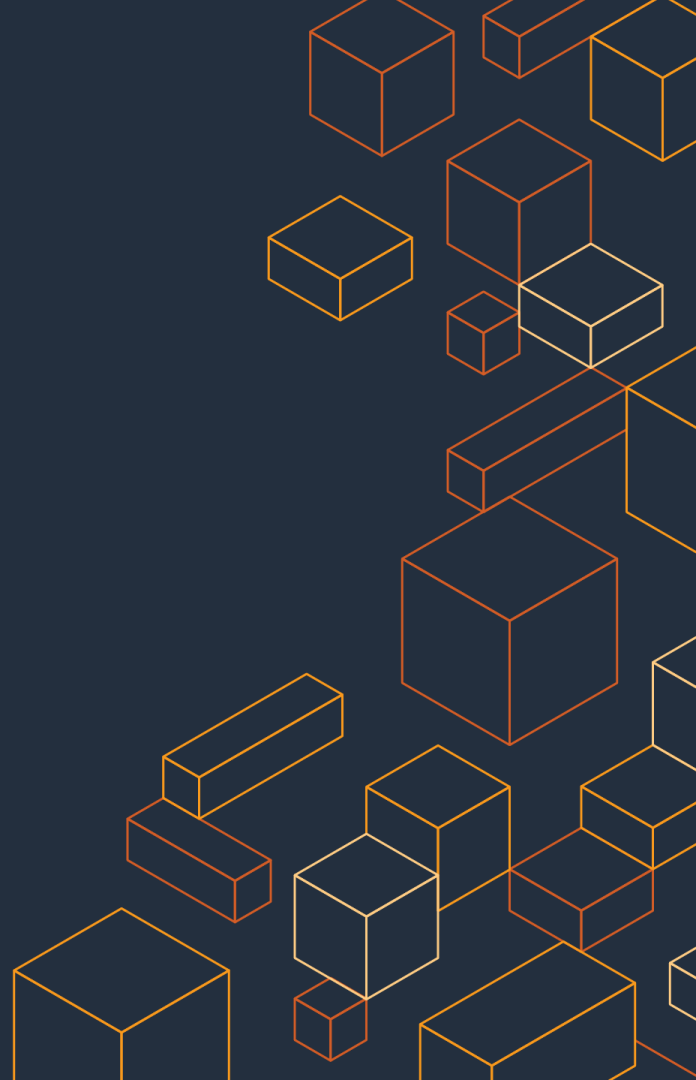

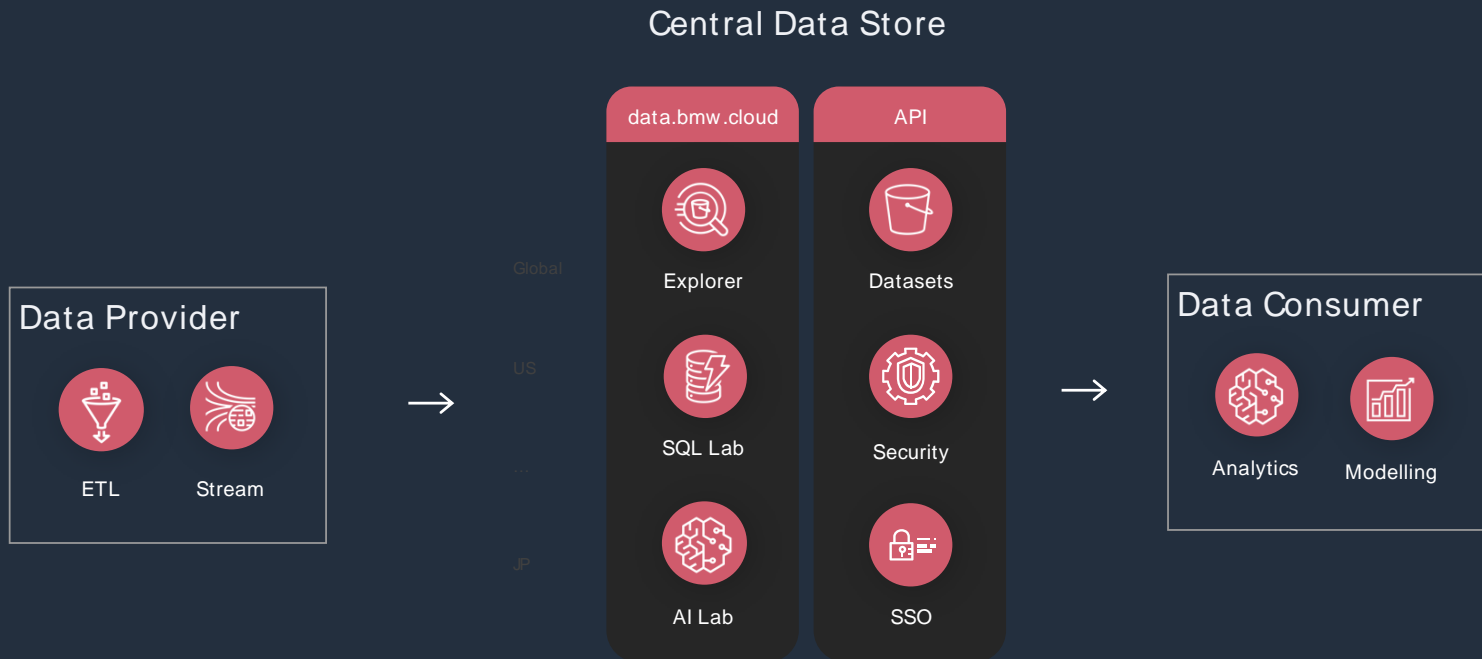

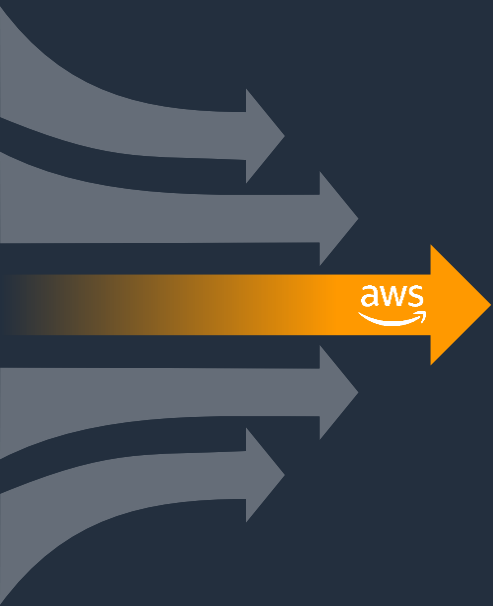
